





Why Learning Beyond, NCCA & NECPA?

EARLY LEARNING CURRICULUM

Standard 2: Curriculum

What to look for in a program:

- Ask about the program's curriculum and how it addresses all aspects of child development. The curriculum should not focus on just one area of development.
- Children are given opportunities to learn and develop through exploration and play, and teachers have opportunities to work with individual children and small groups on specific skills.
- Materials and equipment spark children's interest and encourage them to experiment and learn.
- Activities are designed to help children get better at reasoning, solving problems, getting along with others, using language, and developing other skills.
- Infants and toddlers play with toys and art materials that "do something" based on children's actions, such as jack-in-the-box, cups that fit inside one another, and playdough.

Meet Cora, Director

- Constantly pulled in a million directions
- Center is understaffed, Cora covers classes daily
- Hiring challenges doubled in last year
- Invested \$30,000 in Curriculum last year, and teachers are struggling to understand and implement it
- Training and PD have taken a back seat
- Candidates have:
 - No experience
 - Require a lot of training and time



Meet Monique, Teacher

- Monique has a passion for kids but has limited prior experience
- It's is her 3rd day on the job in a classroom by herself with ten 2-year-olds
- She was handed a curriculum that she's not familiar with and is expected to deliver lesson plans effectively

Maximizing Potential: Tools, Tips & Strategies to Promote Effective Curriculum use

For Directors:

- Identify ways to streamline your approach
- Support your teachers with curriculum implementation
- Seek out support from your current curriculum provider
- Time saving tools could dramatically help address your challenges

For Teachers:

- Provide open-ended questions and prompts
 - Write on sentence strips and post around the classroom
- Optimize your tools
- Provide free access to training and opportunities for in-service hours
- Allocate time for lesson planning and prep
- Create time for teacher reflection

For Children & Families:

- Review/optimize communication approach across center
- Host a Curriculum night
 - Show Children's work
 - Walk families through your curriculum approach
 - Explain the "why" behind lessons/activities
- Share ways to extend the learning at home
